Served nearly 29 years in the US Army, spending the last five and a half years of my career assigned to JPEO Armaments and Ammunition where I was the PM for Joint Services twice and PM Close Combat Systems once. Since my retirement from the Army in 2015, I worked for Chemring North America, first as the Vice President of Business Development, then as the Vice President of Global Business Devlopment, and finally as the President of Chemring North America with Profit and Loss responsibility. Have been with Day&Zimmermann since 2017 and currently serve as the Vice President of Strategic Client Relations as well as the Managing Director of the Joint Venture DZ has with Rheinmetall. I also serve at the Chairman of the NDIA Munitions Executive Summit and am the master of ceremony for this annual event.

I have been a member of the ammunition community since my arrival at Picatinny Arsenal since 2009 and have a perspective of being on the government side and on the industry sides of the table. I think I have a good reputation in the ammunition enterprise and value opportunities for win-win outcomes. I know the ammunition community is close knit, competitive at times, collaborative at other times. I think serving on the NAC Board would be warmly received by members of the ammunition community both in industry and government.

What do you see as the most significant challenge(s) facing the business type you will represent and how would you propose to address those challenges if elected?

My biggest concerns for not only Day&Zimmermann, but the entire ammunition enterprise are as follows:

- 1. Knowing that the current levels of government funding for ammunition are not sustainable. At some point the budgets will contract and that will be a significant event in the ammunition enterprise.
- 2. The excess capacity that has been created over the last few years to support Presidential Drawdown activities in support of Ukraine will lead to winners and losers in the ammunition enterprise.
- 3. Preservation of primacy of the United States ammunition as a worldwide supplier. This will help nullify the impacts of the first two areas of concern.
- 4. Maintaining and creating opportunities for advancement in technology to stay ahead of our near peer competitors such as China.

These issues can all be address through advocacy from both inside the USG and with industry. I think NAC can play a key role in helping advance key technologies through the DOTC process that can position the US for continued preeminence.

D&Z was active with the NAC when Steve Dart was a teammate via the DOTC process. We have done several projects with the NAC via DOTC and all have been favorable.
